REFUGEE RELIEF FUND SEEKS DONATIONS



United Way's mission is to build and strengthen our community by bringing people and resources together to facilitate change. To help support refugee resettlement in our community, United Way Kingston, Frontenac, Lennox & Addington, and City of Kingston working in partnership with Kingston Community Health Centres, KEYS, Community Foundation of Kingston & Area, County of Frontenac and County of Lennox & Addington, have set up a special emergency fund to support this initiative.

The refugee relief fund has helped to assist some of the 200 refugees who have settled in the region since December 2015. Adding to our communities' commitment to assisting refugees in May 2016 Kingston was named a Resettlement Assistance Program Centre by the federal government. To welcome and support children and families fleeing conflict, the refugee relief fund is urging donations be made to those expected to arrive in the coming months.

When you don't know where to turn, dial 2-1-1.



This helpline lets you navigate the complex network of human services quickly and easily, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, in over 100 languages.

To mark 211 Day, on February 11, United Way KFLA and the 211 Ontario helpline are asking residents to make the right call if they want or need help. By calling 211 you can find out information on your community, social and health services, municipal and Local Health Integration Network funded services like housing, employment and mental health and addiction agencies. Call 911 for threats or harm to a person or property that require police, fire or ambulance services. Knowing the right number to call will help residents find the right services for their situation and has the potential to reduce inappropriate calls to 911 from residents.

Everyone benefits from this service, including individuals, families, professionals, community agencies and people facing barriers due to languages, poverty or personal difficulty.

Here are just a few examples:

- A son seeking transportation for his aging parents
- A senior seeking home-care support
- A laid-off employee wanting to find out about employment insurance
- A teenager trying to deal with school or social issues
- A family searching for child care service in the community
