

Emergency Community Support Fund (Round Two)

Frequently Asked Questions

1. What are the size of the grants being administered by United Way?

United Way KFL&A will be issuing grants up to a maximum of \$25,000

2. How much money is available through this fund? Is it possible to find out how much is available for our region?

In this second round, United Way KFL&A will be allocating over \$180,000 and Community Foundation of Kingston & Area will be allocating over \$160,000.

3. If we have received other federal and/or provincial or territorial Covid-19 related funding, can we still apply?

Yes, ECSF resources can enhance and expand your current COVID-19 funded community service so long as expenses are not counted twice.

4. What if we are not currently a United Way funded agency?

We are committed to ensuring that funds are broadly available to community service organizations and agencies working to provide services and support vulnerable populations impacted by COVID-19. **You do not need to be a current funded agency to apply.**

5. Which kinds of community service organizations are eligible?

Organizations providing front-line services to vulnerable populations impact by COVID-19 are eligible to apply, including registered charities, and other qualified donees.

6. We are a non-profit, how can we access and partner with United Way to provide support to vulnerable communities?

Non-profits in Canada are playing an important role in helping to respond to local needs. Unfortunately, we are unable to partner with non-profits who are not qualified donees at this time. United Way will be distributing funds to qualified donees only.

7. Will you pay for activities that meet the criteria that are already underway?

If activities or services are underway, you can apply for additional resources to expand and/or extend the delivery of service for a longer time (up to March 31, 2021).

8. If my agency is receiving the Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy, are we still eligible to apply for funding?

Yes. ECSF funds cannot fund any expenses (including wages) already covered by another source, but can complement existing sources, including the wage subsidy.

9. How many funding requests can be made by one organization?

You can submit more than one application so long as each application is for a different program and outlining the different proposed services and their respective budgets.

10. How will decisions about the funding be made? How quickly can we anticipate a decision?

Applications will be received between Oct 5 and Oct 30, 2020. The review process will occur by end of November, 2020 with decisions made by the end of November. All funding allocations will be distributed before the end of December, 2020.

11. The front-line services we are delivering are at risk of closing without new funding. Are we able to apply for funding under this program?

The purpose of the ECSF is to resource front-line services supporting vulnerable populations impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. Eligible expenses include staffing, equipment, supplies, and related operating costs that allow organizations to provide and deliver services that respond to the current crisis.

12. May we apply to United Way, Community Foundations and Canadian Red Cross?

Yes. Applicants may not, however, apply to more than one funder for the **same** program activities and related costs. The three intermediaries will be coordinating locally to ensure that funds are being distributed to have the best possible local reach to serve vulnerable populations.

13. What are the reporting requirements?

The reporting requirements for this funding will focus primarily on number of services and clients served, and organizations will be expected to periodically provide updates to these numbers throughout the period of the grant. Additional details will be shared with successful applicants.

14. How will United Way Centraides ensure that this funding is reaching the most vulnerable communities? Is there a commitment to access and equity for these resources?

United Way KFL&A is committed to ensuring an open and fair application and review process. We will be working to promote this funding opportunity throughout our community and to support organizations seeking to apply.

We will be considering a number of equity dimensions as we make decisions on how these resources will be allocated locally. These can include populations served, geographic balance, rural and remote access or other systemic challenges.

15. We're part of national organization network, but we are governed locally. Should we look to apply to our local United Way for ECSF funds or should our national office coordinate our applications?

Resources are being distributed across the country through local offices. Local chapters of national organizations should to apply directly to their local United Way or Community Foundation.
